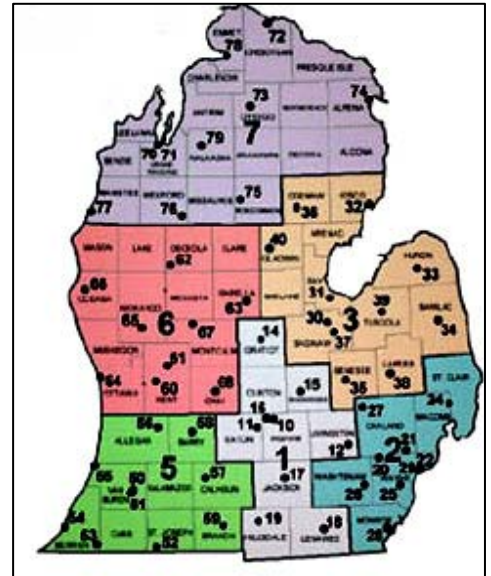


CORE TECHNOLOGY® SELECTED FOR REGIONAL DATA SHARING

Michigan Regions 3 & 6 sign contract for Talon® Software Suite to Facilitate Information Sharing and Crime Analysis between Law Enforcement Agencies

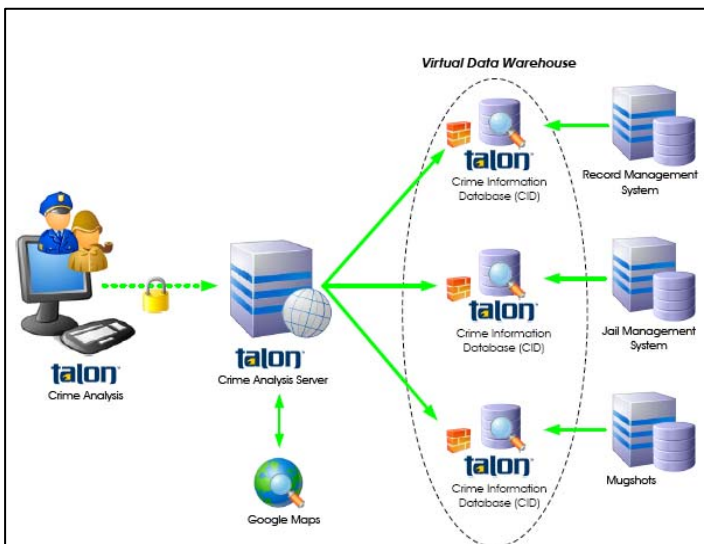
January 25, 2008 – Core Technology Corporation, a leading provider of public safety and criminal justice software, announces today two new contracts with Michigan law enforcement agencies in Regions 3 and 6 (see diagram at right). These regions were awarded grant funds from the Department of Homeland Security to facilitate information sharing across multiple jurisdictions. Core Technology was selected as the vendor of choice for these projects based on their previous experience and success implementing secure data sharing software for other Michigan agencies.

Core Technology’s **Talon Suite** is licensed software currently used for the state’s data sharing network. It allows an end user to perform a single query to access information from local, county and state systems throughout Michigan and northwest Ohio, and the state’s law enforcement information system. The primary Talon software components for these projects are TalonPoint®, Talon Crime Information Database (CID), Talon Crime Analysis, and Talon client software. *“Core Technology’s previous success with other agencies in Michigan and their outstanding reputation made them the clear vendor of choice”, said Bill Smith, Chairman of the Region 6 Homeland Security Governing Board.*



Talon is the client software application that provides the forms for standard queries, organizes data into folders, and formats results to allow officers to quickly locate critical data. Talon adds a level of convenience by allowing access to all of the participating agencies’ data by a single query.

The **TalonPoint** infrastructure establishes a connection between disparate databases, facilitating the exchange of information. Queries are executed in real-time and return responses in XML format using the Global Justice Data Model (GJXML). As part of these regional projects, Core will connect to record management systems and jail management systems using TalonPoints.



The **Talon Crime Analysis** capability makes use of the **Talon Crime Information Databases (CIDs)**, enabling in depth analysis, queries, and reporting – even maps. Users can analyze patterns for a certain crime class and for a specific time frame. The investigator initiates the inquiry and indicates the source of the data, such as a single agency’s Talon CID or the virtual data warehouse; multiple Talon CIDs seen as one database – a rich source of data. Using this approach, an agency can share a map or send out a bulletin in real time to other agencies in a highly secure manner. For quick access to potential leads, the investigator uses the Suspect Generator feature which links people to other forms of data such as addresses, phone numbers, vehicles, and other people.

“The software from Core Technology will provide police officers, detectives, and other public safety personnel immediate access to vital information across the region and the state”, said Chief Todd Alexander, Chairman of the Region 3 Law Enforcement Committee.

“We look forward to expanding the state’s data sharing network to include data from agencies from both Regions 3 and 6”, said Dave Hadsall, President and CTO at Core Technology. “This will provide more information to be shared to more agencies across the state”
